dependant on central funding.

This, of course, is how BMYC has functioned for many years and we have made and still make a genuine – if limited – impact upon the life of the Connexion. With more funding we could do a lot more; with less (or no) funding hitherto large and effective Methodist departments will neither be able to generate the amount of enthusiasm or find the energy levels they once had. Much of value will be lost.

We, for our part, are likely to continue in the pattern we have observed for some time but we need to have an awareness that our experience is likely to be of value to others in the wider church and that a changing scene always presents new opportunities.

Whatever happens we must not lose sight of the prime function of any Christian group – to offer and share the love of God as seen in Jesus Christ and strive to contribute to the building-up of individual believers through encouragement and example using the skills God has given us. BMYC has always sought to do this and, I really hope, despite a changing world around us in our denomination, will continue to aspire to this in the future.
